Question	Answer
<p>What is the definitions of or at least the differences between “critical”, “error” and “warning”?</p>	<p>Files with “critical” records are at the base validation level and will not be stored in the database (e.g., file type, file structure, selected record level checks)</p> <p>Files with “error” records have failed logic validations and will be stored in the database. (e.g., parent/child, dates)</p> <p>Files with “warning” records are informational in nature and will be stored in the database (e.g., empty fields)</p> <p>Additional information is available in user documentation that will be provided.</p>
<p>Does the missing variable report show all fields?</p>	<p>Yes, the missing variable report will show all fields.</p>
<p>One of my centers’ surgeon doesn’t want all participating surgeons to have access to the IQVIA dashboard as some of them are outside locum surgeons. Is there a way to limit access to the dashboard for various surgeons?</p>	<p>At this time if your surgeon signs the Schedule A they will have access to the Dashboard.</p>
<p>Is the fall harvest coming out today, or January 10?</p>	<p>It is scheduled to be released January 3rd. The Anesthesia section of the report is scheduled to be released January 17th. DCRI will send notification when the reports are released.</p>
<p>I had a question based on the test cases we received for UAT, the format of the test data files provided for UAT did not look same as the actual data file format we submit (e.g the test files did not have separate table for demographics, operations, non cardiac data etc). I assume there are not changes in data file format for IQVIA transition and the test files were just custom formatted for testing. Please confirm.</p>	<p>Correct. The files you submit to the production system will need to be compliant against the current or immediate previous version of the STS data specs. An exception has been made for CHSD to process older version of demographics data.</p>
<p>If IQVIA is using the historical data from DCRI, what is the suggested time frame for the cases to be submitted for the 2020 Spring Harvest? or should we submit the 4 year reporting period?</p>	<p>You will need to submit the data since your last harvest. If you made changes to data submitted in a previous harvest up through 2 versions then you will need to submit that as well to update your file.</p>

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Will files in the same time frame that were uploaded in error be removed when you upload an updated file for that time frame?	If records submitted in the subsequent file are updated those updates will be applied to the original records submitted with the original file. If records are removed in the subsequent file those records will be removed. There is no “complete file replace” concept in place where all files within a certain date range will be deleted and replaced with a new file in the same range.
