Use RedCap to Enter Devices Not Available in v4.20.2

To capture devices that aren't available in ACSD version 4.20.2 data specifications, use <u>this RedCap link</u> and bookmark it in your browser. Meanwhile, you should continue to code the implant model fields available on the data collection form as "other, FDA approved device" or "other, non-FDA approved device." This step applies to devices implanted into the aortic, mitral, tricuspid, and pulmonic valve positions, as well as to aortic valve composite grafts.
