


Review Findings from CHSD Annual Report

The annual report, "The Society of Thoracic Surgeons Congenital Heart Surgery Database: 2021 Update on Outcomes and Research," summarizes current national aggregate outcomes for 10 benchmark congenital and pediatric cardiac operations, as well as related quality and research initiatives. The authors, who include Drs. Ram Kumar Subramanyan, John Mayer, and David Overman, write: "This article can serve as a platform for benchmarking performance and improving quality. These activities of outcomes analysis and quality improvement will ultimately allow congenital and pediatric cardiac surgeons to provide better care for our patients." The report appears online in *The Annals of Thoracic Surgery* and will be in the December print issue.



AQO Digital Archive Is Now in STS Learning Center

"The data managers have done an amazing job despite the challenges brought by COVID," said Dr. Felix Fernandez, who serves on the STS Workforce on Quality. "Some were reassigned, many were working remotely or even furloughed. The audit policy has really just formalized the standards that STS has had in place for years."


Mark Your Calendar for Upcoming Group Discussions
