Keep These Harvest Dates in Your Almanac

The Lung and Esophageal Cancer Composite results for the Spring 2022 Harvest (OR dates January 1, 2019–December 31, 2021) were made available on July 11 in the <u>Database platform</u>. Participant results for the Benchmark and Legacy Reports sections will be released separately at a later time. STS will send a communication to the GTSD community when these reports are available.

As a reminder, the Fall 2022 Harvest will close on September 9 at 11:59 p.m. ET, with an opt-out date set for September 13.

The GTSD public reporting update was released on July 11 using results from the Fall 2021 Harvest (July 1, 2018–June 30, 2021).
