#### **Data Submission Deadlines Coming Soon**

The STS National Database is in the process of transitioning to a <u>continuous data submission model</u> for 2017. Data submission for the Adult Cardiac Surgery Database (ACSD) will close tomorrow, February 24, at 5:00 p.m. EST for the first analysis lock period; the suggested data capture window is January 1, 2016, through December 31, 2016.

The General Thoracic Surgery Database (GTSD) and Congenital Heart Surgery Database (CHSD) are still operating under the traditional 3-week data submission period for the spring harvest. Data submission for these Databases will open Monday, February 27, and will close Friday, March 17; the suggested data capture window for both is January 1, 2015, through December 31, 2016.

Remember: To successfully submit your data file, your information must match what the Society and your vendor have in their records for the following fields: Vendor ID, Hospital Name, Hospital NPI #, Surgeon Name, and Surgeon NPI #. ### **Public Reporting Consent Forms Due Next Month**

Consent forms for participation in the next round of <u>STS Public Reporting</u> are due from new enrollees on Monday, March 13. Scores are expected to be posted this summer.

For the ACSD, this update will include hospital and participant-level star ratings for isolated coronary artery bypass grafting (CABG) surgery, isolated aortic valve replacement (AVR), and combined AVR+CABG. The CHSD update will include star ratings based on a hospital's overall observed-to-expected operative mortality ratio for all patients undergoing pediatric and/or congenital cardiac surgery, while the GTSD update will include lung cancer lobectomy outcomes.
