Intermacs to Join the Database

The STS National Database will soon have a fourth component. The Interagency Registry for Mechanically Assisted Circulatory Support, or Intermacs, will become part of the STS National Database on January 1, 2018, joining the Adult Cardiac Surgery Database (ACSD), the Congenital Heart Surgery Database (CHSD), and the General Thoracic Surgery Database (GTSD). Intermacs is a North American registry for patients who receive an FDA-approved mechanical circulatory support device to treat advanced heart failure. Stay tuned for more information on this new chapter for the STS Intermacs Database.

<u>Current Intermacs and/or Pedimacs participants</u>: Data access rights to these databases will expire on December 31, 2017, absent an executed Participation Agreement and an executed Business Associate Contract and Data Use Agreement with STS for each registry. ACSD Updates: Data Quality Reports, Procedure IDs, Valve Abstraction

- Some issues have been found with Data Quality Reports (DQR) for the ACSD, such as the anesthesia section appearing for sites that do not participate and inconsistencies with edits and checks. STS and the Duke Clinical Research Institute (DCRI) are working to address these problems. If you have questions regarding your DQR, contact <u>STSAdultDB@dm.duke.edu.</u>
- Procedure IDs in version 2.9 of the ACSD are being reviewed by STS and DCRI. Any updates will be communicated to your vendor and highlighted in future issues of *STS National Database News*.
- When entering data on valve sizes, please be aware that there are no valves sized less than 15 mm. Please double-check and enter the appropriate size. In addition, please capture the appropriate type of valve implant (bioprosthetic, mechanical, etc.). If you are unsure, refer to the valve manufacturer's website to verify.

Change in Feedback Report for CHSD

Starting with the 2017 Fall Harvest Feedback Report, which will be released in January, CHSD participants will notice the term "episode of care" being used for mortality reporting. <u>Read a</u> <u>letter</u> from Drs. Marshall L. Jacobs and Jeffrey P. Jacobs describing this change.

Continuous Harvesting Available—Submit Data Often

All data managers are encouraged to take advantage of continuous harvesting, which allows you to submit small amounts of data frequently, rather than a large amount all at once. This means you will receive a Data Quality Report after each submission, allowing you more time to make corrections before data submission closes.

Submit Participant Account Updates

Please note that all participant account updates (adding or removing surgeons, changing site name or vendor) should be sent to <u>pcf@sts.org</u>. Also, if you are adding a surgeon, you must submit a <u>Participant Contact Form</u> and signed <u>Schedule A</u>.

Get Answers to Your Clinical Questions

Are you struggling with a clinical question regarding data abstraction? Fill out the <u>Clinical</u> <u>Question Request Form</u> and get a response within 30 days.
